7:00 pm - Manitoba Legislature

Please join us and show your support for a Political Rally and Vigil for Missing and Murdered Aboriginal Women on June 26, 2012 at 7:00 pm at the front steps of the Manitoba Legislature.

The March will commence at 6:00 pm from Young Street and Broadway Avenue to the Manitoba Legislative grounds. The Manitoba Chiefs and other leaders will address the media and the crowd at 7:00 pm. The vigil will commence at 8:00 pm until 9:00 pm.

Grand Chief, Derek Nepinak of Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs, along with Manitoba Keewatinowi Okimakanak, Southern Chiefs' Organization and other Aboriginal organizations, will launch a campaign to call on the Manitoba government for a public inquiry on missing and murdered Aboriginal women. The Chiefs of Manitoba deplore the inaction by both the federal and provincial government for not addressing the missing and murdered Aboriginal women issue adequately.

MKO Grand Chief David Harper expressed his vision for the Government of Manitoba to adopt an "Aboriginal Justice Inquiry Part II" focusing on Missing and Murdered Aboriginal Women in Manitoba. Chief Garrison Settee of Pimicikamak Cree Nation and Chief Arlen Dumas of Mathias Colomb Cree Nation and the families of the victims are scheduled to be in attendance.
