



Dear Chief and Council,

Hello / Tanisi. Please allow me to introduce myself. My name is George J. Morissette and I am a member of the Mistawasis Cree Nation of Saskatchewan. I reside in the small community of Rockland, Ontario a short distance east of Ottawa / Gatineau. I am proud to introduce to you my company Aborcom Resources Corporation ("Aborcom Resources") which I founded on June 21, 2013.

After 11 years of working with Canada's federal government, most of which with Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada, I took the step forward to create my company with the mission to assist Bands and organizations in taking that step forward in realizing greater autonomy and control over their financial future and be a corporate player in enhancing their economic development and community initiatives, which includes assisting Bands taking control over their Indian moneys.

For the majority of my career with Aboriginal Affairs I served at a national level as one of two Band Moneys Advisor providing advice to Aboriginal Affairs senior and executive management in the administration of the Indian moneys provisions of the Indian Act and the *First Nations Oil and Gas and Moneys Management Act*. As part of my duties I also provided advice on the administration of settlement moneys with respect to claims negotiations with the Crown, and advice regarding federal reserve land management with Indian moneys implications.

Career highlights: In August 2011, I was the lead advisor to recommend the Minister of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development approve the release of \$11.7 million of capital Indian moneys, pursuant to a settlement agreement between Canada and the Huron-Wendat Nation of Quebec, into its private trust. Notably, in that same month I was the lead advisor to recommend the Minister approve the transfer of \$240 million of capital Indian moneys of the Ermineskin Cree Nation of Alberta into its private trust. In March 2014, I was also the lead advisor in the implementation process for the *First Nations Oil and Gas and Moneys Management Act* whereby the Kawacatoose First Nation of Saskatchewan became the first community in Canada to assume legal authority over the management and control of its' Indian moneys, that would no longer be administered by Canada under the *Indian Act*. Since 2008, while working with Canada's department of Aboriginal Affairs, I have recommended the approval and release of over \$365 million of Indian moneys to Bands.
